

## Western Wheatgrass, *Pascopyrum smithii*



A native sod forming grass that grows from 12 to 36". Western wheatgrass is a fast establishing grass due to the strong and extensive rhizomes combined with a few deep roots. A good hay source and forage for domestic and wild animals alike. Western wheatgrass is common to the Great Plains, Southwest and Intermountain region of the western United States.

Varieties include: Arriba, Flintlock, Barton, Rosanna and Rodan

Western Wheatgrass is found in roadside mixes, conservation and pasture mixes.
